# THE TEXT

- 1. Dr Michael Bane, who runs The University of Manchester's Bike User Group, has been presented with a national green award. - 3. The <u>NUS</u> awarded him a trophy as well as £100 worth of vouchers for a local bicycle shop. The award was handed over by Professor Maynard Case, Associate Vice-President at The University of Manchester. He said: "Michael is a self-sacrificing and enthusiastic member of staff who is totally committed to promoting the benefits of cycling and encouraging staff and students to cycle to the University. This professor is an inspiration to us all in how to embrace more environmentally-friendly behaviour. I would like to thank Michael for his continued dedication and I'm very pleased that his years of hard work have been recognised nationally."


